Partnership for Observation of the Global Oceans POGO-6 Meeting Brest 29 November – 1 December, 2004 Hosted by Ifremer

Notes to the Agenda

The meeting will take place in Brest (France) from 29 November to 1 December, 2004, and will be hosted by Ifremer, France.

The Executive Committee of POGO will meet on the morning of 29 November. A visit to the Ifremer facilities is planned for the afternoon of Nov. 29. All participants are invited to join this visit, which will be followed by a reception.

The main part of the meeting will begin on 30 December, and is organised into 4 main sessions:

1. Morning of 30 Nov: POGO and GEO (The Group on Earth Observations).

This session will be devoted to an assessment of POGO activities related to GEO over the last year. Those of you who attended the last meeting would recall that at POGO-5 we produced the Yokohama Declaration in support of the GEO initiative. Since then, POGO has become a participating organisation within GEO, and we have been contributing to many of its meetings and documents. This session will be devoted to a progress report, and to an evaluation of how best POGO can contribute to GEO and potential successors to GEO. GEO-5 will be taking place in Ottawa (Canada) on 29 and 30 November, in parallel with the POGO meeting in France. What concrete action can POGO take to enhance ocean observations within GEO? Exploiting the fact that France has a six-hour time advantage over Ottawa, do we want to send a message from Brest to Ottawa, to reach in time for the last day of GEO-5? These and other GEO-related matters will be the focus of the morning session.

2. Afternoon of 30 Nov: Data Management, Assimilation and Coordination

POGO adapted a set of "Good Principles" for data management at the last meeting. How are these principles being implemented in POGO member institutions? What is needed to facilitate better data management practices in POGO institutions? We will also look at data assimilation issues: access to data in a timely fashion, progress in techniques that can be shared among members, the status of the GODAE programme, the need for capacity building and opportunities for mutual help among POGO members, and the benefits that they can derive from ocean synthesis products that are becoming available. We will also discuss how POGO institutions can support and contribute to the GOSUD project (Global Ocean Surface Underway Data) from research vessels. Another issue that will be discussed in this context is the co-ordination of research cruises

internationally: What is already being done, what can POGO do to improve the status? How can we facilitate the exchange of information on cruises in a timely fashion? The focus of the presentations and discussions will be on concrete, pragmatic, immediate steps than POGO can take to improve the situation.

- 3. Morning of 1 Dec: Issues in Operational Oceanography

 The morning of December 1 will be devoted to issues in operational oceanography. How do we adjust to our new responsibilities? How can the coordination between in-water and remote observations be improved? How do we address gaps between coastal and open-ocean observations, and improve coordination between physical, chemical and biological observations? How do we maintain strong links between research and operations, to the mutual benefit of both?
- 4. Afternoon of 1 Dec: Capacity Building and other POGO Activities
 In this session, we will begin planning for POGO-7; report on POGO capacity
 building initiatives, in particular on the new Nippon Visiting Professorship
 Programme; we will examine the finances; elect new members of the Executive
 Council; and review where POGO is, after 5 years of existence, and re-examine
 how we are organised. Are we concentrating on areas where we can make the
 best contributions? If not, how can we refocus? These will be the focus of this
 session.

Note to all speakers: If there are relevant documents, please send electronic versions of the document to the POGO Secretariat by Nov. 10. They will be posted on the POGO web site, and copies distributed to the participants. During your presentations, instead of going over all the material in the reports, please focus on specific issues where POGO can take concrete action to address the situation.
